Overview

Twenty art-making interdisciplinary workshops were offered throughout Minnesota in schools, community centers and museums. Participants learned about the native - Ojibwe and D(L)akota connection to the sky-the stars, and the Earth. Then were asked to explore their own connection to earth and sky, whether it be a cultural and/or a personal connection.

The *Native Skywatchers* (NSW) initiative was founded in 2007 by A. Lee with the over-arching goal to revitilize our human connection with earth and sky, starting with our own communities-Ojibwe and D(L)akota. The NSW initiative weaves together art, science, and cutlure with authenticity and inclusivity.


